

THE SYRIA CRISIS

A DECADE LATER

As Syrians prepare for a challenging year, UNFPA is appealing for a total of \$132.1 million to fund its regional response.

A DIFFICULT YEAR AHEAD

In 2021, Syria faces an unprecedented crisis. Years of instability, a worsening economic situation, funding shortfalls, and the COVID-19 pandemic have converged to place lives at risk, with women and girls continuing to bear the brunt of these challenges. The situation is a stark reminder that the international community must continue to support the needs with tailored programmes.

KEY FACTS

- Gender-based violence particularly intimate partner violence — has increased in Syria and in host communities throughout the region. COVID-19 restrictions have also exacerbated the risks of violence against women and girls.
- Harassment, family violence, child and forced marriages and subsequent pregnancies, and sexual violence and exploitation are consistently reported. New trends are also emerging, such as forced puberty of adolescent girls to marry them off ealier.
- Up to 30 percent of antenatal care and delivery services are being accessed by adolescent girls, highlighting the severity of the issues impacting them.
- With 60 percent of the Syrian population food insecure, there has been an increase of malnutrition among pregnant/lactating women — up to 20 percent from 6 percent in 2019.
- In 2020, UNFPA delivered SRH services to nearly 2 million people, while almost 1.2 million were reached with GBV programmes and over 800,000 with family planning services.

2021 PRIORITIES

SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH / **GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE SERVICES**

Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, UNFPA has continually adjusted its programmes to ensure that people in need have access to quality SRH and GBV services. This has entailed reinforcing infection prevention and control (IPC) measures in all facilities and transitioning a portion of consultation services online. These efforts will continue in 2021 to minimise the fallout of the pandemic and other restrictions.

CASH AND VOUCHER ASSISTANCE

In 2021, UNFPA will continue to pilot new cash and voucher assistance programmes (and to scale up existing ones) where possible to help ensure that the most urgent needs are met, particularly among women and girls. The process involves working with local partners and authorities including women's networks, health clinics, health workers, and GBV case managers. In Jordan, UNFPA is piloting cash in GBV case management, and in Egypt, UNFPA is complementing UNHCR's cash assistance to refugees by expanding coverage to include women and older girls at risk and survivors of GBV.

UNFPA Syria has reached over 75,000 pregnant and lactating women with cash and voucher assistance in January 2021 alone. In northwest Syria, UNFPA has reached 14,000 people with one-off individual protection assistance to date.

LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND

UNFPA continues to adjust its programmes and services to make them more accessible to those most at risk. In 2021, UNFPA will focus on increasing accessibility to more marginalised and at-risk population groups, including adolescent girls, people with disabilities, the elderly, and LGBTQI+ individuals.

It took me many years to realise that I simply cannot stay silent about the abuse I was experiencing at home. While I had a lot of trauma to deal with, the sessions at the centre helped me to process what I was feeling while still reamaining calm and collected.
